'Sticky Knowledge' about formal elements

First hand drawings are to be drawn from a real life object or place not from pictures.

Second hand drawings are to be drawn from a photograph or a picture rather than the real object or place.

An architectural style refers to the features that make a building historically identifiable such as the shape, materials used and construction method.

Amphitheatre is an example of architecture: an oval or circular building with rising tiers of seats arranged about an open space.

Inspiration is being mentally and emotionally moved by a piece of art or design of architecture, object or place.

Use of observation to interpret an idea or feeling about a piece of art.
